



Situation 1

In this example, the business is owner-operated (one person). The requester (later, the administrator) is the same person as the authorised signatory.



Requester



In this case, the requester is also the **authorised signatory**



Requester is now **administrator** in IAMconnected



The administrator is also a user

Situation 2

In this example, the requester is a different person than the CEO of the company and needs the CEO to act as authorised signatory. There are no other employees who will be making use of the service(s).

Authorised signatory grants permission to register the organisation

Situation 3

In this example, the requester is a different person than the CEO of the company and needs the CEO to act as authorised signatory. And there are additional employees who will be making use of the service(s) as well.

Authorised signatory grants permission to register the organisation



Requester is now **administrator** in IAMconnected



The administrator is also a user

Each user creates an IAMconnected account and then links their own account to the organisation

The administrator evaluates the connection request



All users can now make use of the service(s) and request a new service
